## **DID YOU KNOW!**

The Town of Washington Ordains: Ordinance #93:011Spring Road Load Limit Posting **Limitation of Use:** Except as specifically provided in Section V below, it shall be unlawful for any person to operate any motor vehicle weighing more than six (6) tons on any Limited Weight Street, Highway from **March 1**<sup>st</sup> or as deemed necessary.

**Special Permits:** The Road Agent shall issue a special permit after consulting with the Board of Selectmen for the operation of vehicles weighing more than six (6) tons over Limited Weight Streets, Highways, and/or Bridges only after the Road Agent and Selectmen determine that the vehicle will not cause unusual damage to the highway.

**Exceptions:** Delivery vehicles making occasional trips to service residences. Any permitted business in the Town of Washington operating a Motor Vehicle empty over six (6) tons from their place of business to and from N.H. Route 31 and N.H. Route 10.

4.0 APPOINTMENTS DURING THE DAY AND PREVIOUSLY

**4.1** The board explained they are not deterring from the building permit just trying to help you move forward due to the 4 variances that would be required from the Zoning Board of Adjustments.

Alan Dube: suggested other options of repositioning the garage directly behind the house may be a better plan to pass through ZBA.

Frank Anzalone: spoke on behalf of the property owner stating the first design was to place the garage behind the house, which the tree line did not work out or ideal.

Alan Dube: Could you move the driveway and septic, there are septic systems that you can drive on.

Frank Anzalone: no room.

Don Revane: explained it's the property hardship, not personal hardship. We are here to help you make the best plan to bring to the Zoning Board of Adjustments. Once your permit has been denied and is in place in front of the ZBA, they cannot give you suggestions they vote on what is submitted.

Tom Marshall: As co-owner of the property next to you merging both properties would eliminate one variance and one of the structures could be considered an ADU but your house would have to be your primary residence.

Frank Anzalone: Asked if the board ever thought about another Zoning

Allan Dube: We thought about it. Also, you would need to apply for an Energy permit.

Further discussion regarding alternate ways of denying building permits without the upfront cost of Septic plans, etc. As a property owner knowing the permit will be going to the ZBA could the boards place waivers or conditions, and if approved then have the property owner apply for required septic systems, energy permits, etc. The select board thought this was something to consider.

Conclusion: Frank will review the building plans with his client and will resubmit the final plan

4.2 Peggy Carney, (Library Trustee), reviewed the new proposal from North-South Construction

The board explained the new pricing difference is from the miss communication with the entrance door. Also, the cost of a window in the vestibule would be 2,000.00 which the board felt was not necessary, could always have a window in the handicap door.

Peggy: Does this quote include electricity?

Conclusion: the board will look into the electricity and Peggy will reach out to the mason for pricing.

4.3 The board reviewed the town's deeded property and what would the owners need to pay to buy back one's property. The board asked to have Deb D. to forward calculations to the town attorney to confirm the totals.
