➤ Washington Elementary School Public Budget Hearing Notice February 14, 2023, 6:00 pm Elementary School **Limitation of Use:** Except as specifically provided in Section V below, it shall be unlawful for any person to operate any motor vehicle weighing more than six (6) tons on any Limited Weight Street, Highway from March 1st to May 31st or as deemed necessary.

SECTION V

Exceptions: The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to:

- A. Any motor vehicle operated by the Town.
- B. Any permitted business in the Town of Washington operating a Motor Vehicle empty over six (6) tons from their place of business to and from N.H. Route 31 and N.H. Route 10.
 - C. Delivery vehicles making occasional trips to service residences.
